How can I help?

Callers should be prepared to report the alleged victim's name and address, what happened, where and when it happened, who the suspected abuser might be, circumstances



which led to the report, and whether the alleged victim is in immediate danger.

What happens after a report of abuse?



Under the Illinois
Adult Protective
Services Act, a
provider agency
designated to
receive reports of
alleged or
suspected abuse,
neglect or financial
exploitation shall

conduct a face-to-face assessment with respect to reports it receives.

A trained caseworker will interview the person who has allegedly been abused and, if appropriate, assist them in accessing resources and services that may improve their situation. A provider agency shall also refer evidence of crimes against eligible adults to law enforcement.



All reports are kept confidential, and anonymous reports are accepted.
